

J CAMP ALUMNI SURVEY 2008

The Asian American Journalists Association (AAJA) thanks The Annie E. Casey Foundation for providing the funds to track, survey and produce a report on J Camp alumni, showing how effective the program has been with encouraging multicultural high school students to pursue journalism careers. This support has made it possible for AAJA to develop a system of tracking J Camp alum, a system that will continue to be used to collect information in the years to come.

During January 2008, AAJA and The Annie E. Casey Foundation collaborated on designing the survey. The next month, research began to locate the 293 students who graduated from J Camp since the program began in 2001. Students were invited to fill out the survey, posted on surveymonkey.com. The survey was active throughout March and April, with access via a link on the AAJA website's J Camp page. The survey was designed to collect the information anonymously.

Of the 293 students, AAJA was able to identify current e-mail addresses or other contact information for 154 students. A total of 67 students (23 percent of all graduates) completed some or all of the survey questions. See the complete survey and results in the section below.

SURVEY & RESULTS
